






Metro Fire would like you to take a tour of your home and use this checklist to see how safe your household is.

In the	Living Areas:
	The fireplace has a sturdy screen.
	Portable heaters and other heaters are at least 3 feet from anything that can burn
	All candles are in sturdy bases placed high and are never left unattended while burning.
	Matches and lighters are kept up high in a locked cabinet, out of the sight of children.
In the	Kitchen:
	Cooking is never left unattended.
	There is always a pan lid within easy reach should a fire start. Should a fire break out, turn off the burner and carefully put the lid on the pan.
	Tight fitting sleeves are always worn during meal preparation; loose clothes can easily catch fire.
	A fire extinguisher is always available if necessary.
In the	Hallway/Bedroom:
	All smoke detectors are checked monthly.
	All smoke detector batteries are changes at least twice a year.
	Space heaters are kept at least 3 feet from anything that can burn.
<u>Escapi</u>	ng a Fire:
	The family has a home escape plan and practices it twice a year.
	All family members know two ways out of every room.
	If you have security bars on your windows, do you have quick release devices?

FAMILY ESCAPE PLAN



USE THIS GRID TO DRAW AN ESCAPE FOR YOUR FAMILY

DON'T FORGET TO:

- Indicate all doors, windows, bedrooms, walls, stairways and hallways.
- Designate at least two exits for each room -- doors and windows. Make sure you have an escape ladder in each bedroom that is located on the second floor.
- Specify a meeting place outside the home where family members can gather once everyone is evacuated.
- Once at least two family members are at the meeting place, one member should go to the neighbors' house and call 9-1-1.
