2016 FIRE PREVENTION POSTER CONTEST

Pre-K through 6th grade students are invited to participate in a contest honoring **National Fire Prevention Week** (October 9-15, 2016). There are **two** chances to win prizes this year! Students may enter the Poster Contest, the Smoke Alarm Challenge, or both! The 2016 Fire Prevention Week theme is:

“Don’t Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years.”

Part 1 Poster Contest

1. Posters should promote the Fire Prevention Week theme, and encourage fire safety awareness in the home, school and community.
2. Posters must be drawn on an 8 ½ by 11 inch letter-sized white paper.
3. Student’s name, school, grade and teacher’s name must be on the back of the poster.
4. One (1) entry per student.
5. Posters are to be completed by students, without assistance.
6. Only hand-drawn entries will be accepted (no computer-generated imaging).
7. A panel of judges will select the winning posters based on originality, clarity of message, design and age-appropriate skill. The decision of the judges is final.

Part 2 Smoke Alarm Challenge

1. Students will take home the NFPA Smoke Alarm Challenge worksheet. (Teachers should contact their fire department if they need help with printing copies of the worksheet.) Worksheet can be found below, or on the NFPA website in English and Spanish. (First bullet point under “Classroom materials & resources”)
2. Students will fill out the worksheet with a parent or guardian.
3. Every student that brings the worksheet back to school, with at least one smoke alarm date filled in, will be entered to win a prize.
4. Teachers may submit the worksheets, or a list of names of students that submitted a worksheet.

The winners will be notified by November 18, 2016. Three winners (1st, 2nd and 3rd place) will be chosen from each grade level. One grand prize winner for the Poster Contest, and one for the Smoke Alarm Challenge will receive –\$100 for their elementary school, a pizza party for their class and a small prize for themselves. The winning poster will be used in promotional material where appropriate.

All winners will be honored at an awards ceremony where refreshments will be served at Shriners Hospitals for Children, attended by their parents, teachers, principals and local fire officials at 5:00pm on Tuesday, December 6, 2016.



AS PART OF FIRE PREVENTION WEEK, your child has been learning about smoke alarms. Having smoke alarms in your home is very important. Smoke alarms let you know there is a fire. Working smoke alarms also give you time to get outside and stay outside if there is a fire.

Smoke alarms don't last forever. Every 10 years you need new ones. When they are 10 years old, they don't sense smoke as well. With your child, look at the date on the back of all the smoke alarms in your home. This is also a good time to push the test button on all smoke alarms, and make sure they are working.
