



GROWING CALL VOLUME STRAINS LOCAL FIRE AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICE

Increasing call volume for medical and fire emergencies over 10 years



30% increase for medical emergencies

40% increase for fire emergencies



Every minute a fire **DOUBLES** in size

AGING, DETERIORATING STATIONS AND EMERGENCY VEHICLES COULD LEAD TO UNSAFE WORKING CONDITIONS AND IMPACT RESPONSE TIMES

Fire stations are **50+ years old**

Comprehensive Capital Needs Assessment Exceed the Current Budget:

Replace outdated + deteriorating lifesaving equipment







Provide additional emergency response resources to ensure rapid emergency response



Construct new stations in high-population areas to reduce response times

MEASURE O COULD ADDRESS NEEDS:

\$415 million for funding needs

to air pollution

- \$19 per \$100,000 of assessed home value
- \$6.50 per month for the typical property taxpayer

Ensure reduction for firefighter exposure

✓ Local control + fiscal accountability

MEASURE O WOULD HELP THE DISTRICT:

- Maintain fire + medical emergency response times
- Sustain local fire protection
- Protect natural disaster response + wildfire prevention
- Support rural fire protection + emergency medical response services
- Attract and retain qualified firefighters + paramedics
