

Dear Stakeholder,

We want to hear what types of fire management projects you would like to see considered in Metro Fire's Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP).

Metro Fire's goal is to identify a range of projects that are broad in their geographic and jurisdictional scope. Below are some questions that can be asked to identify projects for consideration.

- What types of projects/activities would make fire less damaging to structures and/or wildlands? Are there specific areas that should be targeted for fuel management?
- How can fires be better prevented? Are there specific educational programs, prevention programs, or other management programs that should be implemented by Metro Fire?
- What can Metro Fire do to improve response to wildfires? For example, cross agency training, implement use of hand crews, or develop a comprehensive pre-fire plan for each community.
- What might help the community recover after a wildfire?

Metro Fire will continue to gather input on the types of projects that should be considered in the CWPP and will keep stakeholders apprised as new information becomes available.
